

## RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, the City of Savannah, Georgia expects to receive a total of \$4,110,542 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in the form of Community Development Block Grant, Emergency Solutions Grant, and HOME Investment Partnerships funds for fiscal year 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, it is a condition for receipt of such funding that the City submit to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development a comprehensive multi-year Housing and Community Development Plan, including a One Year Action Plan for fiscal year 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has developed a 2018-2022 Housing and Community Development Plan and a 2020 One Year Action Plan that have been published and made available online for public comment for a period of 30 days, and two public hearings have been held on May 8, 2019 and October 10, 2019, to discuss and receive comments on the plans; and




