Front wall of brick laid in Flemish bond, incised sandstone lintels over door and windows, 9 over 9 windows in first two floors; 6 over 9 on third, cornice with rare federal motif in wood trim. Side wall has half moon attic window facing west.

1st floor:

Fluted woodwork in all windows and doors, front hall has elliptical arch with fluted pilasters and plaster acanthus leaves in arch, stairway with mahogany hand rail over tapered balusters and monkey tail in newel post, graduated beveled paneling under stairs, floral wood trim on risers extends to attic. Floors all original random width heart pine. All rooms have original woodwork and doors throughout. Double drawing rooms separated by six panel double doors under fine glazed flat arch with Greek key and other elaborate woodwork detail, slight bombe in entablature supported by fluted columns. Paired Adam mantels with free standing Ionic columns with extensive carvings in frieze, serpentine tops with dentile molding, Greek key design repeated in mantels and also has interesting pyramid motif.

2nd & 3rd floors:

Simple Adam mantels in all four upstairs bedrooms, one door with original large wrought iron rim lock and keeper.
