The Georgia Legal Services Program, Inc. (“GLSP”), with the support of Savannah Pride, Inc., will be bringing to Savannah an attorney with specialized knowledge to speak to and with the local transgender community.

Transgender people in Georgia may have a variety of legal needs relating to their gender identity. We live in a state that gives no intentional recognition to transgender individuals, and the laws can even be hostile to transgender lives. However, many transgendered/interested individuals may be surprised that there are benefits and protections available to them, in spite of this. Cole Thaler, an attorney who has litigated transgender issues, and who is now a supervising attorney with the Georgia Legal Services Program, will be available for one night to speak on the rights of transgender individuals, and to answer questions which members of our community may wish to have answered.

Transgender persons have presented to GLSP with various legal issues. They may need help changing names and sex designations, accessing necessary medical care, and fighting back against discrimination in employment and other areas. Some transgender people may face even more challenges when it comes to accessing public benefits, housing, and other necessities. Come join Georgia Legal Services Program for a discussion about the rights of transgender Georgians and the community’s most pressing needs.

****As part of GLSP’s “Cementing LGBT Relationships”, any lgbt attendee will have the opportunity to complete and execute a legally compelling advance directive for healthcare(sometimes call “healthcare power of attorney”), which will allow them to designate the person they choose to speak for them on healthcare matters.**





The order requires the parties in such cases to exchange certain documents listed in the order within a specified time frame. A copy of the production of documents order must be served upon the defendant together with the complaint and summons.
- 3. TRANSITIONAL PARENTING SEMINAR ORDER**, effective March 10, 2010 and reinstated January 3, 2011: This order requires the parties in certain domestic cases involving the interest of children under 18 years of age to complete the "Transitional Parenting Seminar". Electronic Filing

All civil filings must be done **electronically**. There are Personal Access Terminals (PAT's) in the Clerk's office (Chatham County) and at public libraries. Ask for the PAT. If you are filing for a fee waiver with an affidavit of poverty, they will assist you with the process. For name changes, you can complete a poverty affidavit and then file the case without waiting for a judge's approval. For other civil cases, such as Petitions to Change Sex ID Marker, the Clerk will open your case as pending. After the judge approves your *Pauper's Affidavit*, your case will be assigned a new case number and your case status will change from pending to open.


