



Community Engagement Summary



The City of Savannah held a series of community engagement events to gather feedback directly from residents. During these sessions, participants proposed specific recommendations aimed at improving the City. Each session revolved around a key priority area.

- Livable Built Environment and Infrastructure
- Quality of Life
- Community Development & Resiliency
- High-Performing Government
- Public Safety
- Economic Access, Opportunity & Vitality

These sessions were held at various locations, including Coastal, Delaware, JEA, Liberty City, PARC, and Windsor Forest. To gauge the level of support for each idea, participants used a dot voting method, with the number of dots indicating the level of interest for each recommendation. The data reflects broad participation, with each location covering all six priority themes, offering insights into resident priorities across different neighborhoods and areas of city function.

Summary by Priority Area

- **Community Development & Resiliency:**
 - Housing Preservation & Affordability: Strong focus on protecting existing single-family housing, addressing affordability, and dealing with blighted properties.
 - Neighborhood Standards & Accountability: Calls for better property maintenance, including cracking down on negligent landlords.
 - Cultural Inclusivity: Desire for outreach and events that highlight diverse cultures equally.
- **Economic Access, Opportunity & Vitality:**
 - Small Business Support: Concerns about operational costs (especially rent) and the need for support/revitalization.
 - Workforce & Skills Development: Emphasis on education fundamentals, access to trade job training, and more youth employment opportunities.
 - Communication: Need for clear communication from the City on policies and resources.
- **High-Performing Government:**
 - Fiscal Responsibility & Tax Equity: Significant interest in sound financial management, efficiency, reducing waste, and tax fairness (specifically mentioning SCAD).
 - Service Delivery & Efficiency: Improving the usability and responsiveness of city services like website/bill payment, mental health service provision, and processes for utilizing small and local businesses.
 - Communication & Transparency: Need for clear, timely communication.
- **Livable Built Environment and Infrastructure:**
 - Roads & Traffic: High priority on repairing roads (potholes, repaving), fixing traffic flow issues, and ensuring roads are evaluated properly ("drive them then fix them").
 - Water & Drainage: Concerns about water quality (prioritizing drinking water), drainage, ditch maintenance, and flooding.
 - Community Access: Providing free access to community events, recreation, and cultural activities.
- **Public Safety:**
 - Mental Health Crisis Response: Strong emphasis on improving how the City responds to mental health crises, including better training and resources for first responders.
 - Crime Surveillance & Deterrence: Interest in using technology like cameras and shotspotters, particularly in specific crime-prone areas.
 - Community-Based Approaches: Suggestions include providing more activities for youth and improvements in emergency (911) response times.
- **Quality of Life:**
 - Infrastructure Maintenance for Livability: Focus on maintaining essential neighborhood infrastructure like canals/ditches and roads/potholes that directly impact daily life.
 - Accessibility: Ensuring physical accessibility for handicapped individuals in public spaces.
 - Targeted Services & Green Space: Improving services for specific groups (e.g., seniors) and adding/maintaining community green spaces.
