

SAVANNAH, GEORGIA. GEN. SHERMAN'S HEADQUARTERS. Sherman's three hundred mile "March to the Sea" ended with the capture of Savannah just before Christmas 1864. In front of the City Exchange Sherman reviewed his army January 7th 1865. This old weather-beaten Colonial mansion of yellow stone was the headquarters of the conquering general.

General Sherman's Headquarters, Savannah, Georgia

It was here that General William T. Sherman established his personal headquarters during the Union Army's occupation of Savannah, Georgia, 1864-65. This building, facing Madison Square, is now the Parish House of St. John's Episcopal Church, located next door. The church chimes were saved from Federal confiscation during the Civil War as a result of personal intervention of General Sherman, who requested President Abraham Lincoln to spare them.



SHERMAN'S HEADQUARTERS

General William Tecumseh Sherman ended his march through Georgia at this house which he occupied as his headquarters from December 22, 1864 until February 1, 1865.

The house is notable in its own right as one of the country's finest examples of residential Gothic architecture, the detail of the interiors being as sumptuous as any to be found in America.


The house was built for Charles Green, an English cotton merchant. The architect is unknown. Construction was begun on July 24, 1850 and completed April 18, 1861. Mr. Green offered his house to General Sherman and stated that he did so in order to spare a Georgia citizen indignity.

In 1892 it was acquired as a residence by Judge Peter W. Meldrim, distinguished Georgia jurist and President of the American Bar Association 1921-1923. Here he entertained President McKinley, Major General FitzHugh Lee, Daniel C. Gilman of Johns Hopkins, and Senator Mark Hanna.


In 1943 it was acquired from the heirs of Judge Meldrim by St. John's Episcopal Church for use as a parish house and rectory. The funds with which the house was purchased were raised in part through public subscription by the citizens of Savannah.

GENERAL SHERMAN'S HEADQUARTERS SAVANNAH, GA.

The house now owned and occupied by Gen. P. W. Meldrim on Madison Square, is familiarly known as Sherman's Headquarters. Before the War between the States in the fifties, an English merchant, of large wealth, the late Charles Green Esq., bought from the City of Savannah the block bounded by Bull, Harris, Whitaker and Macon Sts., facing Madison Square. The rooms are very large and ceilings high. The floor is of tile. The circular stairway is marble. The house is built with thick walls into which slide the sash and blinds. Broad piazzas surround three sides of the house. In front there is a fair sized flower garden and on the western side a Court Yard. The offices extend in an L from the main residence. The general appearance is attractive for the stately old house with vines near the oriole windows makes a picture of the olden time. It was this house that Gen. Sherman appropriated for his headquarters when in Dec. 1865 he captured Savannah at the end of his march to the Sea. Daring Gen. Sherman's stay in Savannah, that is from his capture of the City until he moved into Carolina, the house as official headquarters. Some years, twenty-five, ago Mr. Green died and Gen. Meldrim became the owner of the property and has resided there ever since.
