

It is a kind of paradise which has wandered down, a miraculously enchanted wilderness." The camera has caught four fleeting glimpses of what Mr. Galsworthy described. There are over five hundred varieties of camellias, towering up to twenty-five feet. Magnolias are in profusion. Azaleas are everywhere.

A great structure of concrete and steel spanning the Cooper River, costing over \$6,000,000.00. Two and a half miles long, the bridge rises to a maximum elevation of 150 feet. The total height of the bridge above water level is 295 feet to the tip of the steel framework supporting the span. From this lofty eminence an unexcelled scenic driveway is afforded, with a view covering the harbor and islands and mainland. The lights on the bridge are visible for over fifty miles.

GEORGE EDWARDS HOUSE/14 LEGARE STREET

**T**hroughout the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, Charleston's wealth and importance as a political and trading center enabled it to overshadow other towns and cities in the Low Country. Many planters built houses in Charleston for business and social reasons and to escape the malaria which made living on plantations so dangerous during the warmer months. Francis Simmons, a planter from Johns Island, built this house around 1800, but it carries the name of a later owner, George Edwards. Edwards added the elaborate gates and fences to the property, and the medallions on either side of the door contain his initials.


29 EAST BATTERY

“*T*oo poor to paint, too proud to white-wash” summarizes the popular sentiment that Charleston possesses its rich architectural heritage because of the economic hardships it experienced during and after Reconstruction. Though the city’s economy did experience difficulties, there were individuals who prospered after the war. John Simonds became the owner of this house in 1894 and he remodeled it in the Italian Renaissance Revival style. Two piazzas on the front of the house date from that time. The house remained in the family’s possession until 1943. Francis Porcher, a cotton broker and delegate to the South Carolina Secession Convention, built the house in 1857.

TOMBSTONE/ST. PHILIPS CHURCH


St. Philip's Protestant Episcopal Church is the oldest Episcopal congregation in Charleston. The graveyard surrounding the church was used for burying members of the congregation; in 1768 land across Church Street was set aside for the burial of "strangers and transient white persons." Diseases such as smallpox, measles, yellow-fever, and dysentery have frequently plagued the city. Cool weather often caused the outbreaks of disease to abate, but each incidence severely affected populations of established colonists, new immigrants, slaves, and Native Americans. A yellow-fever epidemic occurred in the city as recently as 1905.

LIVE OAKS/ROCKVILLE

**I**n 1989 Hurricane Hugo caused significant damage to the woodlands of South Carolina, particularly those in the Low Country. Located to the south of Charleston on Wadmalaw Island, these live oaks in Rockville did not experience the most severe winds of the hurricane, and they appear much as they did before the storm. The Spanish moss on the trees is not parasitic but epiphytic, deriving its nutrients and water from the air and rain. Spanish moss is native to the southern United States and the West Indies.

Rockville is 20 miles southwest of Charleston.

GRACE CHAPEL/ROCKVILLE

**R**ockville is a village on Wadmalaw Island with sandy, tree-lined lanes and houses built to afford their residents maximum comfort during the summer. It is similar to other small communities Planters established to escape that season's malaria. From the waterfront, Seabrook and other nearby islands across Bohicket Creek are visible. Completed in 1840, Grace Chapel was a chapel-of -ease for St. Johns Church on Johns Island. Moved to its present location in 1884, the chapel recently appeared in the film Paradise.



VIEW TO THE SOUTHWEST/FORT MOULTRIE BEACH


Prior to the start of the War Between the States, cannon at Fort Moultrie fired on the steamship Star of the West as it attempted to bring supplies to Union troops stationed at Fort Sumter. Since the end of the nineteenth century, an expanding military presence has benefited the Charleston area. The Naval Ship Yard, the Naval Weapons Station, the Ballistic Missile Submarine Training Center and the Charleston Air Force Base have stimulated the development of North Charleston. Affected by base closings mandated by Congress in 1993, the naval presence in Charleston will be significantly reduced by April of 1996.

Pictured, left to right, are a fishing boat, the U.S.S. Mooseburgger, and Fort Sumter. Ubiquitous fiddler crabs occupy the foreground.

PRINCE WILLIAM'S CHURCH/SHELDON

**P** rince William's Church, better known as Sheldon, derived its popular name from Sheldon Plantation. An advancing British army burned the first church on the site in 1779. The structure was rebuilt in the 1820s, but Union troops repeated the process of destruction in 1865, after using the church as a stable. Molded bricks form the four columns of the portico. "Put log" holes in the walls were used for erecting scaffolding; they would not be visible if the building was not in ruins.

Prince William's Church is located off Highway 17S in Beaufort County.

IRON GATE/RUTLEDGE AVENUE


**S**ephardic Jews began establishing Charleston's large Jewish community as early as the beginning of the eighteenth century, and other Jewish immigrants came to the city from England and the Netherlands forty years later. Carolina's Proprietors encouraged adherents of diverse Protestant creeds to settle in Charleston to counteract the political strength of immigrants from Barbados and to foster economic development. French Huguenots came to Charleston after Louis XIV revoked the Edict of Nantes; Baptists and Quakers also established themselves in the city in the late seventeenth century.

This gate is the entrance to the Brith Shalom Beth Israel Synagogue.

LIVE OAK/DRAYTON HALL

One of several plantations the Drayton family owned in areas as diverse as Canada, Kentucky, and the Low country, Drayton Hall served as the family's management center. Phosphate mining and lumbering activities provided the Drayton family with income, while also altering the shape of the land. Left unattended, the plantation has again become overgrown. In discussing the maintenance and use of the land, Richmond Bowens, a descendant of Drayton slaves, said "Nature is wiser and stronger than the knowledge of man."

Drayton Hall is located on the Ashley River in Charleston and is open to the public. It is a property of The National Trust for Historic Preservation.





BALL FAMILY PLOT/STRAWBERRY CHAPEL

In 1707 James Child began planning a town on the Cooper River's west branch. Dating to 1725, Strawberry Chapel is the only functioning remnant of this unsuccessful venture. As a chapel-of-ease for St. Johns Parish in Berkeley County, Strawberry Chapel served the local population, holding "the parochial rights of baptising and burying." In 1865 Keating Simons Ball buried the silver of Biggins Church, the parish church, to prevent Federal troops from looting it. Recovered after more than eighty years, the silver was given to the care of Strawberry Chapel, which had begun to hold regular services.

Strawberry Chapel is located north of Charleston on  
the west branch of the Cooper River.



PRINGLE HOUSE

**R**obert Pringle, a merchant and Assistant Justice of the Province who came to Charleston from Scotland, built the house at 70 Tradd Street in 1774. Like other Charleston single houses, this three and one-half story structure is one room wide, and it features a Victorian bow window and a Regency piazza. The high basement elevates the building to permit sea breezes to enter and cool the rooms on the upper stories. The kitchen and other dependencies were at the back of the house. The Pringle family retained ownership of the house until 1886.

CALADIUMS/MAGNOLIA GARDENS

**M**agnolia Gardens is one of several public gardens around Charleston which have helped form popular images of the South and its gardens. Azaleas and camelias were first planted at Magnolia in the 1840s. Newer areas of the gardens intermingle native and ornamental plants in unusual settings such as the adjacent swamp. Swamps are a common feature of the Low Country. These important wetlands catch excess water during wet periods and discharge it throughout the year, becoming nearly dry during more arid months. They also provide a varied habitat for diverse animal and plant species.

Magnolia Gardens and the Audubon Swamp are located on Highway 61 north of Charleston and are open to the public.

EARTHQUAKE BOLT/HASELL STREET

Charleston's residents have recorded minor earthquakes since 1698, but on August 31, 1886, an earthquake with tremors so intense that they were noticeable in Boston struck the city. Seismologists estimate that the earthquake measured near 7.5 on the Richter Scale. More than one hundred buildings in Charleston had to be demolished after the earthquake. The total damage equalled one quarter the entire value of the city's homes and other buildings. By reinforcing damaged structures with metal rods, some property owners saved their buildings and restored them to a sound condition.

Several lion's head earthquake bolts are found on the northeast corner of Hasell and King Streets.



OSCEOLA GRAVE — FORT MOULTRIE

Osceola, a famous chief of the Seminole Indians, was born in Florida in 1803. His wife was seized as a slave in 1835, and he began a war which was carried on until he was captured. He died in Fort Moultrie in 1837. Fort Moultrie, on Sullivan's Island, has figured extensively in history. During the Civil War the fort was abandoned, when Charleston Harbor was evacuated in 1865.

The Ashley River Memorial Bridge spanning the Ashley River at Charleston, S. C. forms an important link in the Atlantic Coastal Highway between North Atlantic states and Florida.

This bridge, built at a cost of \$1,200,000, was dedicated May 6, 1926 to the memory of South Carolina's soldiers dead of the World War.

To accommodate the limited navigation of the Ashley River, a double bascule draw of 110 feet is provided. This bridge has been declared by prominent engineering authorities to be one of the most beautiful structures in the United States.
