

## Saint Patrick's FAQs

# All Location Vendors must be on private property, the City of Savannah does not provide locations for vendors.

1. When can I submit my application to participate in the Festival? **March 2, 2020**
2. How can I obtain an application for the event? **Via website, mail or pick-up in person**
3. When will applications be available? **Applications will be available online at [www.savannahga.gov/stpats](http://www.savannahga.gov/stpats) or obtained at 305 Fahm St. after February 19, 2020.**
4. I'm a mobile vendor, what days can I sell during the Saint Patrick's Festival? **Hawkers' permits are only good for March 17, 2020. No additional days are permitted for Hawk.**
5. What type of license is needed to sell during the St. Patrick's Festival? **There are two types of permits issued during Saint Patrick's event; A hawker (mobile vendor), and fixed location vendor.**
6. What are fees for a permit? **Fees for a Hawker range from \$45.00 to \$120.00; Fees for Fixed Location range from \$87.00 to \$387.00**
7. What form of payment is accepted? **Cash, Money Order, Credit Card only**
8. I want to sell food/non food from a site; does the City of Savannah provide sites for selling? **The City of Savannah does not provide locations for vendors. Each location must have Zoning approval before the application can be processed; also a food permit is needed.**
9. Do I need a City of Savannah Business Tax Certificate if I have a BTC within the State of Georgia? **No, providing proof of your current BTC.**
10. Where can I peddle my merchandise? **The following streets, sidewalks and public ways are off-limits to peddlers, festival hawkers or street vendors; The River Street "controlled" festival zone; all of the area north of the south curb line of Bay Street; all City Parks and Squares; all of the City Market areas bordered by Bryan Street on the north, Congress Street on the south, Barnard Street on the east, and Montgomery Street on the west; and the traffic lanes along the designated parade route when and where the parade is in progress.**
11. What are the times for vendors operating as a Hawker? **7am-7pm**
12. What are the times for vending for fixed location? **Friday, 6pm – 12am; Sat. 10 am - 12 am ;Sun.10am-6pm**
13. What's the deadline to submit an application? **All applications must be received by the Revenue Department, located at 305 Fahm Street, by 12 noon, Wednesday, March 11, 2020. All hawker's permits will be available for pick-up from the Revenue Department between the hours of 2pm to 4pm on March 16, 2020. No applications will be processed on March 13-15, 2020. All Fixed Location vendor permits will be delivered.**
14. My business operates as a Non-profit, do I need a BTC? **Yes, with proof of IRS 501(c)(3).**
15. Can I share my permit with my co-worker? **No, each person with merchandise must have a hawker's permit and ID.**
16. What if my permit is lost or stolen? **No duplicate permit will be issued.**
17. What if my merchandise is confiscated, when can I pick up my merchandise? **You can pick up your merchandise on March 18, 2019 from the designated location.**
18. Can someone pickup my permit? **Yes, providing proof of your original ID.**
